The Rev Anne Bond writes:

I don't know about you, but on 6 May I was transfixed by the television, viewing the Coronation of King Charles III. Despite Britain's Lords and Ladies being asked not to wear ermine and coronets, the procession being a fraction of that for the late Queen Elizabeth's funeral, and the King sporting as low-brow robes as he could get away with, it was a spectacle of stunning magnificence. We Brits do pomp and circumstance better than anyone else, and in the doing, broadcast to the world at large that we are still a force to be reckoned with.

But there are many among us who think of the financial implications of such an occasion - and shudder. How many hospitals could have been built for the millions spent on crowning our new King? How many houses constructed for the homeless, carers funded for old peoples' homes or food banks stocked?

At the risk of being considered 'political' (outside my remit) rather than 'spiritual' (what I'm supposed to be), it seems to me these concerns are valid. However, the matter is considerably bigger than that. When during a dinner party held in his honour Jesus was accused of condoning heedless extravagance by allowing his feet to be anointed with expensive oil instead of the money the oil cost being given to the poor, his response was 'you will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me'. (John 12:1-11) Like so much of what Jesus said, this deceptively simple answer has many layers.

Essentially, Jesus was condoning the giving of the best with no thought of reciprocal gain. King Charles' mother, the late Queen Elizabeth II, at her Coronation took for her own personal ruling principle the Christian value of Royal Majesty equating selfless service rather than selfish gain. Her son and heir has followed her example, throughout his life as well as when he was being made King. It was explicitly spelled out at his Coronation, in the pattern and words of the formal shape of the ceremony, in the Archbishop of Canterbury's sermon, and in the attitude of those taking part.

A Coronation is a rare occurrence in this 21st century. Spending the millions it undoubtedly cost (especially at a time of international world-wide financial difficulty) resulted in an outpouring of the best for the edification and joy of everyone of all languages who attended it, in the Abbey and lining the route of the procession and all over the world watching it with such enjoyment on TV. Funding medical care, providing accommodation for everyone, and so on, is for our political shakers and movers - no less important, and incidentally something we must take extremely seriously next year when there will be a general election; but the provision of so deeply morally significant a spectacle as the widely broadcast Coronation of a good, honest, environmentally aware and spiritual man as our new King is rare and precious and not to be taken lightly. The sick and homeless will always be among us, in every generation - but the relentless march of time ensures that our moral influencers need to leave something behind by which to remember them. If Jesus' often repeated commandment to 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength, and love your neighbour as yourself' came across via the whole vast spectacle of the Coronation to the millions watching as it did to me, the millions it cost will have been well spent.

ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING MAY 2023

Present, Chairman Cllr J Burden, Vice Chairman Cllr I Bugler, C Vosper, C Melville, Dorset Cllr C Brooks.

Cllr Burden and Cllr Bugler were unanimously agreed as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively for 2023-24

CLERKS REPORT ON MATTERS ARISING

Cllrs noted the meeting of the Chair and Vice Chair with the NT at their Weston Farm Buildings on the 24 April.

DORSET COUNCIL

Cllr Brooks gave an update on recent changes of membership and responsibilities in the Cabinet at Dorset Council

CORRESPONDENCE

Cllrs noted that filming at Winspit had been cancelled due to the reported state of the cliff faces. Warning signs had been put in place by the NT.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

The Clerk updated Cllrs on the unauthorised encroachment and obstruction by contractors work for Happy Cot-

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tage in London Row Worth village. This was seriously impeding vehicle parking and loading/ unloading access to London Row cottages. This was reported to Dorset Council who indicated it was a planning enforcement matter. DC Highways would hold a watching brief.

The PC noted complaints raised about the state of the footpath leading up to the Church Fields from near the WM Car Park. It was agreed to seek assistance from the DC Footpaths officer to deal with the two issues raised of serious encroachment and the poor state of the surface especially after rain

The PC noted the DC Highways overnight closure of A351 East Street Corfe Castle From 8pm onwards 3 May 2023. Cllr Brooks clarified that this was an enabling start time with the full closure operational from 10pm for one night.

The Clerk reported on progress towards new information signs for Worth Car Park specifically updating the basic running cost as currently £17000 per annum

DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION

The PC noted ongoing issues with the ongoing damage to the footway o/s the WM Village Hall which need permanent resolution possibly with a guard rail.

The PC noted the Clerks verbal report on future use of WM village Hall for alternative meeting place now that the CV 19 emergency was over. He would seek to liaise with their management committee for future dates in 2023-24 when the main room was available as the upstairs room alternative was not acceptable for Parish Council meetings as an alternative.

The PC noted that the fence around the boot scraper had been moved away at WMCP. This would be replaced by the contractor.

The PC noted the state of the fences at the rear of WMCP and the contractor would be asked to liaise with the land owner and prepare a repair and renewal estimate for future consideration by the PC.

The PC noted that the salt bags in Worth village needed collecting up and that the grit bag supplied at the junction of Haycrafts Lane and the A351 was now leaching out and needed relocation and a permanent enclosure. The Clerk was to seek a source for a new Bin at this location as well as the replacement dog bin further up by HXCP.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 6 June in HXVH.

THE RAMBLING GARDENER

June is beautiful in Purbeck. I am sitting outside to write; enjoying bird song and all the fresh colours. We are so lucky to live in England.

Elsewhere in the world there are so many droughts, floods, gales and earthquakes that we are unlikely to get, but those countries will be unable to grow enough food for themselves or to export. As we have relied on imported food it will be a shock not to be able to get whatever we want in the shops, so start growing your own. It is fun and plants can grow inside as well as outside so have a go.

Here in the Purbeck valley on rich soil everything grows, clematis and Roses do very well and there are varieties of every colour which will flower all year round, giving a riot of colour which is at its peak in June. On poor or limey soil plants will grow slower and smaller, leaving a more delicate, airy feeling and not needing so much weeding.

On acid soil there will be Azaleas and Rhododendrons in full flower and many have striking foliage. Most magnolias, beech or Japanese maples also prefer acid soil and give shade and flowers and colourful leaves bringing beautiful colours all year round.

I would like to just enjoy this time of year but I have very good soil so there is weeding in all the beds. Also, a June cutting back in the flower borders gives room for the autumn Dahlias and Aster which may flower until Christmas. All plants like to have the ground covered so most of the weeds are left on top of the soil to rot down feeding the plants as well as saving time taking weeds to the compost and then returning it later as a mulch.

With the changing climate it is hard to know when to do jobs, but carrots, cabbages, peas and beans all need sowing. I am grateful for the rain we have had this year as all the water butts are full so I will have enough water to keep the vegetables watered.

The flowers will mostly have to manage without much watering and I will take out the plants that are not adapting to the changing weather. It is good to buy a water meter, they are not expensive, they are quick and easy to use, and they stop one from watering unnecessarily.

We often talk of "the good old days" but some problems have always been there! I remember mother telling me to never let Ground Elder get established in my garden and she showed me some that had got into the roots of a tree.

She told me to dig it out which was hard work and should have taught me to be observant; but unfortunately, I was not and some has got established at the bottom of the garden where it is spreading fast. I am digging it out and luckily the ground is damp so it is going well. Ground Elder is the only plant I don't put on the compost heap.

Planting wild edible plants anywhere in your garden is good. A wild lawn could be edible, good for wildlife and not need mowing. Some you may already have are Dandelion, Calendula, Queen Anne's Lace, Nettles and Plantains. Wild edible plants are still eaten by a large section of the global population and ensure both affordable food and nutritional security.

Remember, do what you like in your garden, but enjoy it. Happy gardening.

Ken Faggoter owned the first and, for a while, the only car in Gypshays. He had moved from Bognor Regis to be Clerk of Works for the council, which was building a new estate at Grease Head, now called Days Sydenham and Holms Roads (all names derived from Swanage councillors at the time).

Grease Head was probably a corruption of Grey, a badger, and Head, a face of stone left by quarrying; badgers not infrequently dig their setts in such places. On our walks to Swanage as children, Grease Head was the most boring stretch – just open fields with old quarry workings relieved by clambering along the top of the wall beside the road. Ken had two sons of Cub or Scout age and he took over being Scoutmaster. Meetings were held annually in a hut in Durnford or the Village Hall.

Reg Bartlet, a builder, owned the strip of land along the west side of the Drove and gave the section next to the High Street to the Scouts. Formerly, it had been part of the Serrel Durnford estate. Presumably they had planted the trees at some point during their two hundred years of ownership. Several were of a reasonable age, such as the tall Scots pine and the pair of Conker trees (the latter an important resource for boys). All in all, it was a great place to make camps, climb trees and generally muck about.

Ken set about building the hut with volunteers. He persuaded and cajoled people effectively and generally made things happen. I imagine that without his drive and hard work – assisted by his son David – it would not have come into being. We were given the job of digging the foundations which, like everything else we did as Cubs, was a bit of a lark. Frequently, we extracted oddities: old bottles, tin cans, etc. One evening, Ivan Peart, headmaster of the Langton Village School, walked up Back Lane (now East Drove) to see what was happening.

He saw us swinging pickaxes and admonished us, remarking that he had seen a man killed in similar fashion as soldiers desperately dug in under fire in the trenches. I believe he had lung damage from gas. Little did us lads know! Ken convinced people to give materials. I am not sure what the various quarries did but Ernest Norman and Victor Bower (both with children in the Cubs or Brownies) helped in dressing and laying the stone.

My father gave the window on the High Street elevation but stopped there (the others are concrete). The roof tiles are the same as some of those seen on Days Road houses. I do not recall the opening of the Scout Hut performed by Ralf Reader in May 1954, who was known for organising the annual Gang Show at the Albert Hall in London.

About that time, we beat the bounds of the parish; the Cubs undertook the southern cliff section, whilst the Scouts walked further off to North Hill before we met up at Gully. Sometimes we played wide games in the long evenings of the summer. We staged a defence of Seacombe from a Swanage troop.

Once, south of Leeson, there was a sudden confusion: adult partridges flapped around us on the ground and one of us boys stepped on a chick, hideously wounding it. Grey partridges were not uncommon then, but now they are very rare following the arrival of agricultural pesticides. Most meetings were held in the new Scout hut where, each week, we promised ARKALA (Lillian Harden) that we would “do our best”.
