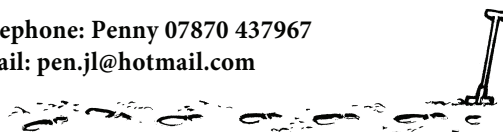

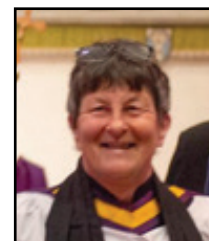

SWANAGE FOOD BANK

Iwould like to thank everybody who has so generously donated to the Food Bank over the Christmas period. The Worth film club together with the Christmas Carols raised an amazing £1000.

During 2025 the Swanage Food Bank were able to help 539 households (784 adults and 410 children) who need extra support.

NATIONAL TRUST

FREE ENTRY PASS FOR LOCAL FAMILIES

Did you know that local families can get a free visit to Corfe Castle? Free access and car parking passes are held at St George's School in Langton Matravers for families of pupils there. You just ask for the passes and they will be signed out to you, for return after you've visited.

There are also free parking permits for families wanting to visit Studland, covering Shell Bay, Knoll Beach, Middle Beach, South Beach. Again, these are to be handed back to the school after use so other families can use them.

It's a great chance to experience the wonderful history and landscapes on our doorstep, especially when for so many, finances are tight. Please ask about them at the school reception.

LET'S HEAR IT FOR PURBECK GOES WILD!

Purbeck Goes Wild's mission to connect local children and families with the incredible nature on their doorsteps. Launched in 2024, this pioneering programme has united schools, businesses, organisations and nature lovers across Purbeck.

So far, the impact has been huge:

- 35 organisations including 14 schools on board
- 46 family nature events delivered
- 62 teachers trained to lead outdoor learning in Purbeck
- 75 work experience opportunities/offers for local young people

CORFE PPG

The Corfe PPG has developed a strong and effective working relationship with the Corfe Surgery, working together for the benefit of patients in the practice catchment area.

Last October following a suggestion from PPG members, the PPG initiated an exercise class for over 65's. Held in the Bill Carter room at Corfe Village Hall, classes were weekly and offered, free of charge, for a six week period to see what interest there might be. The aim was to improve strength, mobility and balance for those who do not do regular exercise and to encourage social interaction.

Led by a qualified instructor, Vanessa Neish, who also runs classes in Swanage and with sessions coordinated by PPG member Sally Feben Smith, up to 16 men and women attended regularly at each class.

The feedback from the sessions has been very positive and Sally is now organising further classes from January which she reports are proving popular. Those who have not attended before are being encouraged to join to meet other locals in a fun friendly atmosphere whilst doing some regular exercise.

We are grateful to the Corfe Charity for providing funding for the initial free classes and whilst a charge will now be made for classes this year some additional funding has been kindly agreed by the Corfe Charity to support some of the running costs incurred this year.

LANGTON MATRAVERS PARISH COUNCIL JANUARY MEETING

Thankfully, a light agenda this month and little to take us away from careful monitoring of Storm Goretti as it battered our homes in Langton presenting a good test of the efficacy of the NT's natural flood defences and our roofs (though most seem grateful that the weather since the last PC meeting has not tested either of these all too much). "So far so good" is the verdict as this report is written and we hope it (the report that is) ages well – Storm Goretti, should age quickly and be gone!

NATIONAL TRUST REPORT

Ben Cooke, member of the Swanage Streams Partnership, is leading two walks in January which offer a chance to see how the NT is helping protect our community and wildlife. These walks will feature the project sites up close, explain natural flood management and why it matters for Purbeck, and reveal the benefits for both local people and nature. There will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions and share thoughts, so all residents are welcome. Ben will welcome those interested at Spyway Carpark.

DORSET COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Ben joined us late – hot foot from East Stoke (which attempted to offer an attraction competing for Ben's attention this month, but clearly could not maintain interest – so Ben joined us at 8pm or thereabouts). Ben presented a very brief report noting that a lot of the focus at DC is on setting the budget this month with the first public indication of the direction coming Tuesday next week. Those with superior knowledge of DC communications will be the first to have an inkling of how the various black holes will be filled.

PLANNING

The meeting discussed:

- P/FUL/2025/06558 Location: Yards Brake, Valley Road, Harmans Cross BH19 3DX Proposal: Construction of an outdoor swimming pool with an associated building and retained use of the access path and the related application P/FUL/2025/06973 Location: Yards Brake, Valley Road, Harmans Cross BH19 3DX. Proposal: Retain access path. Council had no objection to the former but noted the volume of well-informed objections from residents with respect to the latter, particularly touching the matter of unauthorized intrusions into ancient woodland over the past two years.
- Council considered both proposals and noted that it undermines confidence in all planning processes if any development which might have been refused had it been properly notified and reviewed prior to commencement should be subject to a retroactive permission once the works had been carried out. Council voted unanimously to object to P/FUL/2025/06973 on these grounds and the grounds that the intrusions into Ancient Woodland should not have occurred in the first place.

Next Council Meeting: The next Parish Council meeting will be held on 12 February, 2026 in the Langton Matravers Village Hall - please come along and remonstrate with your (always affable) representatives.
